working with APKD and Duke Health. Jenna was matched with Bo in Colorado. Bo's donor matched Morten Birktoft, and Morten's donor, Pieter Wichmann, was matched with Jason. In August 2023, Morten and Pieter traveled from Denmark to UofM Health where their surgeries took place. Jenna says that donating her kidney was one of the most rewarding things she has ever done. "I wish I had more kidneys because I would do it a hundred times if I could. It only made my life better," said Jenna. She found it especially rewarding to meet everyone in the paired exchange face-to-face in November 2024, and says she has gained lifelong friends in Morten, and Pieter, Bo, Jason, and his wife Lisa. Lisa introduced Jenna to her fiancé, and Jenna jokes, "I traded a kidney for a husband." As a sweet addendum to this story, Jason will be officiating Jenna's wedding this spring.

Jason has been busy writing and performing music while making the most of each moment with his wife and two children. "I'm so grateful for this new lease on life," he says, "a chance to see my daughters grow up and spend many more years with my partner in crime, Lisa."

Each transplant facilitated by APKD represents a mother, father, brother, sister, friend who is no longer dependent on dialysis and is given a second chance at life. But every transplant means even more than the restoration of one life—it symbolizes reunited families, the courage of selfless kidney donors, and the hope given to patients facing uncertain futures.

 –Jason Adamo, who met everyone in his donation chain for the first time in November 2024 Our partnership with MedSleuth and the addition of two transplant coordinators has helped APKD experience exponential growth over the last two years. External transplants increased by 24 percent, while internal transplants surged by 336 percent. As we continue to build on this strong foundation, we expect to facilitate 500

transplants within the next 12-18 months. "Our primary focus is expanding our network and ensuring customer satisfaction. We want to personalize the paired exchange experience while maintaining standards of efficiency and excellence," says APKD Lead Transplant Coordinator Krista Sweeney.

# A note from our founder



Leading Innovation: APKD at Walter Reed Medical Center in Bethesda, MD.

In 2024, your support enabled APKD's leading role in developing innovative transplant solutions. We've now completed 12 Military-Share Deceased Donor-initiated chains in partnership with Walter Reed National Military Medical Center and the US Military. This has allowed us to multiply the gift of one deceased donor kidney: one such kidney helps two or more people by starting a chain that ends with an active duty member of the US armed forces. We continue to help overcome financial barriers to transplantation, increasing access to living donor kidneys. To date, the APKD has invested more than \$4M to build the software the connects a Nobel Prize-winning algorithm to serve patients in 15 countries around the world. In 2024, we amplified our impact and became a leading provider of KPD services in the Middle East. We also expanded in India and our software put together the first 3-way kidney exchange ever performed in Brazil. Our Global Kidney Exchange program (in partnership with the Niels Due Jensen Foundation) made Pieter and Morten's transplant possible (see p.1). Your generosity has been crucial to our success.
